What is Title I?

St. Marys Middle School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support state and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging state academic standards to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement.

School Plan for Shared Student Achievement

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how St. Marys Middle School will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. St. Marys Middle School values the contributions and involvement of parents and family members to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that St. Marys Middle School will support family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and at home.

How is it revised?

St. Marys Middle School invited all parents to provide input in the Parent and Family Engagement Plan via E-blast, website, and Facebook. Parent input and comments regarding this plan were welcomed during the school year through an online form. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. We also distribute an annual survey to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and the use of funds for family engagement. Requested topics from the FY23 survey included helping with helping with homework, test preparation, effective parenting for academic success, and understanding state academic standards. Parents and family members can also give feedback during parent meetings and activities during the school year. The school will submit any parent comments to the district if the Title I Schoolwide Plan is not satisfactory to parents.

Who is it for?

All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. St. Marys Middle School will provide full opportunity for the participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, of migratory children, and guardians of children served through the Methodist Children's Home.

Where is it available?

The revised school plan will be posted on the school website. Parents can also access the plan in the Parent Resource Center and receive a copy by email.

2023-24 District Goals

-To increase the percentage of students in grades 3-12 meeting proficient or higher on the GMAS ELA EOC/EOG from 53% to 56% (ES), from 52% to 55% (MS), and from 59% to 62% (HS).

-To increase the percentage of students in grades 3-12 meeting proficient or higher on the GMAS Math EOC/EOG from 59% to 62% (ES), from 47% to 50% (MS), from 50% to 53% (HS).

-To increase the percentage of students in grades 3-12 meeting proficient or higher on the GMAS Science EOC/EOG from 64% to 67% (ES), from 59% to 62% (MS), from 66% to 69% (HS).

2023–24 School Goals

-To increase the ELA GMAS performance at the proficient or distinguished levels from 58% to 61% for FAY students.

-To increase the Math GMAS performance levels at the proficient or distinguished levels from 56% to 59% for FAY students.

-To increase the ELA and math performance levels for students with disabilities from 60% to 63% (ELA) and 70% to 73% (math).

School-Parent Compacts

As part of this plan, St. Marys Middle School and our families will develop a school-parent compact, which is an agreement that parents, teachers, and students will develop that explains how parents, students, and teachers will work together to make sure all our students reach grade-level standards.
